Year 1	<p>I can apply the spelling rules from Year 1 Appendix.</p> <p>I can spell words containing each of the 40+ phonemes I have been taught.</p> <p>I can spell common exception words.</p> <p>I can spell the days of the week.</p> <p>I can name the letters of the alphabet in order.</p> <p>I can use letter names to distinguish between alternative spellings of the same sound.</p> <p>I can add the suffix –s or –es to words.</p> <p>I can use the prefix un-.</p> <p>I can use the suffixes –ing, -ed, -er, -est when the root word doesn't need changing.</p> <p>I can write simple sentences (using words I know) that are read aloud to me.</p>	<p>I can hold my pencil correctly.</p> <p>I can begin to form lower-case letters in the correct direction.</p> <p>I can start and finish my lower case letters in the right place.</p> <p>I can form capital letters.</p> <p>I can form digits 0 – 9.</p> <p>I can understand which letters belong to which handwriting 'families'.</p>	<p>I can say a sentence out loud before I write it down.</p> <p>I can write two or more short sentences in order.</p> <p>I can re-read what I have written to check that it makes sense.</p> <p>I can tell other people about what I have written.</p> <p>I can read aloud my writing so that other people can hear me.</p>	<p>I can use and understand grammar from Year 1 Appendix.</p> <p>I can leave spaces between words.</p> <p>I can join ideas using 'and'.</p> <p>I can punctuate sentences using capital letters and full stops.</p> <p>I can punctuate sentences using question marks.</p> <p>I can punctuate sentences using exclamation marks.</p> <p>I can use a capital letter for proper nouns (names of people, places, the days of the week) and 'I'.</p>
